Join Advocates Taking to the Streets to Oppose Medicaid Managed Care Pilot

The Community for All Coalition, a group of disability rights advocates from across Illinois, representing state and local organizations, stands firmly opposed to the State of Illinois' Medicaid Managed Care pilot program. It is likely to affect nearly 40,000 people with disabilities in Du Page, Kane, Kankakee, Lake, Will, and suburban Cook



counties in the next six months. The state claims this program could save \$200 million in Medicaid costs incurred by Illinois and help reduce the deficit. We see these cuts as detrimental to the health of people with disabilities. We see the corporate control of health care as a retreat from the goal of guaranteed health care for all as a human right. Medicaid Managed Care is another form of budget cuts.

If you cannot attend either rally in person, you can still participate by contacting Governor Quinn during a statewide action call-in day on Thursday, August 12 and Friday, August 13. You can use this suggested script when you make your phone call:

Hello, my name is ________, and I live in _______ County. I'm calling to let the Governor know that I'm firmly against the Medicaid Managed Care Pilot Program the Department of Healthcare and Family Services is planning to run in six counties in northern Illinois. Managed Care takes away choice and consumer control from people with disabilities, which means they can't pick their own doctors and specialists to give them the medical and long-term care they need. I call on Governor Quinn to stop Medicaid Managed Care and take responsibility for providing health care to thousands of people with disabilities in Illinois because health insurance companies care more about their profits than the people they cover.

It's My Life Rally for Self-Directed Supports in Illinois

Join the Alliance and the Campaign for Real Choice on Tuesday, August 31 for a rally in Bloomington pushing for Self-Directed Supports for people with disabilities in Illinois.



Self-directed Supports means that people with disabilities have control over their services. A person would have an individual budget, and be able to use that budget to get the services he/she wants. Each person would also have a "support broker" who would help him/her make plans and receive the desired services and supports. The "support broker" would make sure that everything is within the budget.
